

Strength in Breadth at 2017 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination (HKDSE)

A total of 96 students sat for 2017 HKDSE. In 10 subjects, including all the four core subjects of Chinese Language, English Language, Mathematics and Liberal Studies and 6 Electives, the percentages of our students achieving Level 4 or above were higher than the Hong Kong average. In 9 subjects including all the four core subjects, almost one out of every two students scored Level 4 or above. Subjects where students performed extremely well was M1, with more than one-third of students attaining Level 5 or above.

Overall, the percentage of students attaining the minimum requirement for university admission (33222) was 85% while the Hong Kong average was 35.5%. The performance in the four core subjects is very gratifying with 92% and 93% awarded level 3 or above in Chinese Language and English Language respectively, which are much higher than that of Hong Kong on average as the averages were 54% for the former and 51% for the latter. 91% and 86% were awarded level 3 or above in Liberal Studies and Mathematics when the Hong Kong averages were 66% and 59% in these two subjects.

The top student, TSE LOK YIU, scored 37 points for six subjects with Level 5* in Chinese Language, Mathematics, Liberal Studies, Physics and ICT and Level 5 in English Language. She excelled in M1 and attained Level 5**.

Among these 96 students, 77% of them were offered Joint University Programmes Admission Systems (JUPAS) degree places including Bachelor of Science in Actuarial Science, Bachelor of Arts (The University of Hong Kong), Bachelor of Science in Quantitative Social Analysis, Science (Hong Kong University of Science and Technology), Nursing, Engineering, Economics, Integrated Bachelor of Business Administration etc. (The Chinese University of Hong Kong).

With overseas university offers counted, a total of around 80% of our students have been offered degree places while the other 20 % will be studying Associate Degree and Higher Diploma courses.

As we are celebrating our students' HKDSE successes, we are determined to work harder to reach new heights and break new records.
