HKDSE 2021

With their unrelenting effort and unyielding support of teachers and parents, our S6 students achieved gratifying results. A total of 91 KTLS students sat the 2021 HKDSE. In 5 subjects, they achieved better than the Hong Kong average at Level 5 or above. In 12 subjects, they achieved better than the Hong Kong average at Level 4 or above. The most commendable results went to Chinese Language and Liberal Studies for core subjects, with more than half of the cohort attaining Level 4 or above.

The performance in the four core subjects was truly meritorious with 94% and 88% awarded level 3 or above in Chinese Language and English Language respectively, which were much higher than that of Hong Kong on average as the averages were 58% for the former and 53% for the latter. 96% and 100% of KTL students were awarded level 2 or above in Mathematics and Liberal Studies respectively when the Hong Kong averages were 81% and 89% in these two subjects.

We congratulate our students on their excellent results and may God bless them on their new journeys.

English Language



SEED Project

Mathematics and STEM



STEM lecture and seminar

60 S2 and S3 students attended a science lecture titled "China's Lunar Exploration Programme" on 25 June. Mr. Hu Hao, the Chief Designer of the Third Stage of China's Lunar Exploration Programme, shared our nation's achievements in space technology and the recent implementation of the Chang'e 5 lunar exploration mission. It helped to inspire our students' enthusiasm towards scientific research endeavours.



"Digi-Science" Video Production Competition for Hong Kong Secondary Schools 2020-21

Our STEM research team was awarded championship in the "Digi-Science" Video Production Competition for Hong Kong Secondary Schools 2020-21 (Senior Secondary Division), organized by the Hong Kong Association for Science and

Humanities



History Outing – Visit to military sites along the Wong Nai Chung Gap Trail

S5 History students joined the "Exploring the Hong Kong Story Series – Battle of Hong Kong" Programme and visited military sites along the Wong Nai Chung Gap Trail. The interactive role-play learning activities enabled students to learn more about the fierce battle between the troops at this particular strategic geographical position of Hong Kong, and facilitated a deeper understanding of the military defense stories of wartime heroics during the Second World War. It was a highly informative and inspiring life-wide learning experience to raise peace awareness and help students reflect on Hong Kong's cultural heritage.

Our History Department and the National and Social Caring Committee joined "The Future US" Cultural and Historical Exploration programme, which was organized by the Hong Kong Youth Hostels Association. Starting from Mei Ho House, students explored and experienced different facets of the culture and history of Sham Shui Po. They also joined a sharing session with Ms Joel Kwong, Programme Director of Microwave International New Media Arts Festival, to exchange views on the topic of "Future Virtual Network." Under the guidance of tour guides and speaker, students learnt how Hong Kong has been transformed over time, and they were inspired by the activities in creating a better Hong Kong in the future.



S4 Social Enterprises Human Library Workshop



Our Liberal Studies Department organised a social enterprises human library workshop for S4 students, to share about the situation of ethnic minorities, the elderly and the youth at risk in Hong Kong, as well as how social enterprises help with different groups in Hong Kong. Students learnt about the concept of social entrepreneurship to begin serving society by using their own knowledge.

It helped establish a learning community among students and connected active learners to share their thoughts and exchange ideas.


Classroom Without Boundaries Project


"Home Visiting Programme" under "Together with Joy" Project

Career Guidance Day and Exploration Programme






Joint School Symposium for English Teachers 2021




School Anniversary
