This year, we proudly celebrate our students named Outstanding Students of Kowloon City District and their outstanding representation at Model United Nations forums, including the DGS and Oxford Model United Nations Conferences. 


Sprouting New Thoughts, **Soaring to New Heights**

To sharpen these skills, we've integrated divergent and lateral thinking exercises into our lessons, encouraging students to explore perspectives, challenge assumptions, and craft solutions. We provide students with the tools necessary to connect the dots in new and unexpected ways, whether they're dissecting biotechnology advancements or uncovering truths in historical narratives.


A perfect example of such effort is the Mathematics Department's participation in the Quality Education Fund's Thematic Network programme (QTN), where they led four other schools in promoting mathematical modelling. In the S3 curriculum, lessons were implemented and open demonstration classes were conducted, guiding students to take on the role of teachers and use mathematical modelling to design student selection processes for exchange

> programmes. This integrated real-life problem-solving with mathematical thinking, empowering students to become pragmatic and engaged learners.



Also, The Mathematics Department collaborated with the City University to develop an application that aimed at solving learning problems faced by junior secondary school students. They also took their students to a mathematics competition. They won a merit award for the concept of the 'Healing Birds Smart Healthcare' app, which demonstrated their ability to apply mathematical knowledge to solve problems.

Artificial Intelligence is no longer the future—it's the present. Two years ago, our school anticipated Al's transformative impact on education and began integrating it across subjects. In Chinese Language, students refine their writing skills using Al-assisted feedback and bring poetry to life through image generation. In STEAM research projects and the Biotechnology Task Force, students uses Al to analyze scientific literature, refining both efficiency and accuracy. Meanwhile, ICT students delve into AI tools, exploring their functions while programming robots to grasp the very principles of artificial intelligence.

This year, two aspiring pilots took to the skies in the UNSW-DSSSC Future Pilot Program, getting their feet wet in operating a flight in Sydney. The STEM-tastic Adventure introduced students to drone soccer, robotics, and biotech experiments, igniting curiosity and passion.

At Future Science Prize Week, students engaged with top researchers in life sciences, materials science, and Al, gaining firsthand insights into groundbreaking innovations. Likewise, The Future Hong Kong International STEM Education Forum connected them with Al experts, expanding their understanding of technology's role in shaping the world.

A love for literature is nurtured not only in the solitude of reading but also in shared storytelling, discussion, and exploration. This year, our students engaged in activities that deepened their appreciation for the written word and its power to shape minds and cultures.

Our Book and Tea Rhythm Activities, held every Friday at De Xin Academy, provided a space for students and teachers to explore literary masterpieces while enjoying fragrant tea and delicate treats. Similarly, the First Reading Day (13-14 February) centered around The Little Prince, engaging students in booth games, reading workshops, and a travel literature seminar to encourage curiosity and reflection.

Beyond the classroom, students participated in literary and cultural excursions. The Literary Walk • Shadow Hunt in Dragon City (8 July) led them through Kowloon City to explore local heritage and engage in descriptive writing. Meanwhile, our S5 students' visit to the Hong Kong News Museum (3 July) provided insight into journalism ethics and media literacy through interactive sessions with professionals. The Bamboo Dream Hong Kong Book Launch (26 February) at Ocean Park combined

literature with conservation, enriching students' understanding of giant pandas and their cultural significance.



Traditional arts also played a key role in broadening students' literary experiences. A Cantonese Opera performance of "The Summer Snow" (6 November) offered an immersive experience in this poetic art form. Meanwhile, Chinese Cultural Week: Hundred Flowers for Spring (17-21 February) celebrated literature through poetry competitions, literary discussions, and hands-on creative workshops, culminating in the spirited Fei Hua Lin Competition.

Our students excelled in competitions and public

engagements. In the "Stories of Lion Rock" Youth Essay Competition, S4 Lim Chi Ching and Ting Ching Hee placed second and fourth, showcasing their deep connection to Hong Kong's heritage. Additionally, four students were selected to host the RTHK radio program "Life Stages Across Cultures", where they will explore global traditions through storytelling.

Finally, literary inspiration flourished in the Reading Seminar (14 January), featuring guest writer Mr. Ng Chun Yin, whose engaging discussion on Paper Clay ignited students' passion for creative writing.





A profound sense of national identity is woven into the fabric of our students' learning experiences. Through historical drama, students relived the struggles of the Anti-Japanese War under the guidance of professional theater groups, culminating in a microfilm production set to serve as an educational resource for future scholars. Equally enriching was the National History Mystery Solving Competition, where our students meticulously crafted an immersive escape room, transporting participants through pivotal moments in China's modern history.

Cultural heritage and celebration also play a vital role in our school's engagement with national identity. Students embraced traditional attire and customs during the Chinese New Year Casual Wear & Traditional Attire Day, while the "Red Packet for Warmth" Charity Drive reinforced the spirit of giving. At the Intangible Cultural Heritage Exhibition, students experienced the rich tapestry of Cantonese opera, Tai Chi, and centuries-old craftsmanship, deepening their appreciation for cultural preservation.

Further enriching this national connection, students explored historical ties between Hong Kong and the mainland through the exhibition "From the Bund to the Harbour: Canton and Hong Kong Reconnected." The "Growing Together, Walking with China Merchants" program took students across Sichuan, Chongqing, Shanghai, and Beijing, exposing them to the country's historical and economic milestones. Their reflections and experiences were later shared at a formal presentation, celebrating their journey of discovery.

Marking a significant milestone, our students proudly participated in celebrations of the 75th anniversary of the People's Republic of China. From martial arts performances to a joint-school commemorative event, their involvement reflected a deep-rooted appreciation of the nation's progress and cultural heritage. Moreover, participation in the MGM Cup Historical Knowledge Competition saw our students excel in academic exchange, engaging in thought-provoking discussions with peers from the Greater Bay Area.

Our school remains positive about the importance of fostering social responsibility and global awareness through a diverse range of activities centered around sustainability, volunteerism, and service learning.

The Mid-Autumn Environmental Recycling Campaign engaged students and staff in recycling mooncake leftovers and boxes, promoting waste reduction in line with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The campaign was a part of the broader effort to deepen environmental consciousness.

Our effort in community service earned recognition with the JC Volunteer Together Outstanding Caring School Award(Gold). This prestigious award highlighted our school's dedication to volunteer work, particularly through the Social Innovation — Benevolence, Breakthrough, Innovation, and Action program, which has inspired numerous student-led initiatives.

The Home Service Learning program, a collaboration with Form 4 students, focused on addressing poverty and homelessness. Students applied design thinking to plan and execute creative activities, enriching the lives of those served and embodying our motto, "Thou art the Light of the World." Similarly, the Walking with You service learning initiative, in partnership with the Hong Kong Society for the Blind, allowed students to engage with the visually impaired and intellectually disabled, fostering empathy and understanding.

Students also participated in the Hong Kong Mental Health Association's "Deep" Joy Carnival, where they volunteered to promote mental well-being and holistic health through interactive experiences. In addition, they attended the Hong Kong Original Marine Conservation Musical, which emphasized the importance of ocean ecology and conservation, aligning with our focus on nurturing environmentally conscious global citizens.

To further reinforce environmental responsibility, five S3 students represented our school at the Opening Ceremony of the Advocating Carbon Reduction Program. They gained valuable knowledge on low-carbon living and are now equipped to lead future initiatives promoting carbon reduction. Additionally, our representatives attended the Carbon Reduction Action - Continuation Ceremony, as a collaborating partner with the Environmental and Ecology Bureau in reducing carbon emissions and promoting waste recycling.

Geography Field Trip

Our Geography Department introduced students to practical applications of geographical knowledge through various activities. A themed talk by the Survey and Mapping Office, The Land Department, provided insight into map production methods and career opportunities in the field. The outreach team of the Environmental Protection Department also visited our school to host the We-recycle @ School Outreach Booth Activities, enhancing students' awareness of recycling and environmental conservation. Furthermore, S6 Geography students participated in an industrial fieldwork study in collaboration with the Faculty of Education, The Chinese University of Hong Kong. Their visit to InnoPark and Tung Tau Industrial Area allowed them to conduct environmental quality assessments and reflect on the relationship between industrial activities and environmental sustainability.



In May, the 3rd Guangzhou-Hong Kong-Macau Sister Schools Educational Exchange Annual Conference saw our students engage in a Model United Nations Assembly focused on


